Every end of the month the volunteers physically verified the bills and jot down the unit consumed, the bill amount and advised inhabitants on the measures they could take to save the power by using LED Bulbs.
- **World environment day:** On June 5th 2016, a group of 20 to 22 volunteers participated tree plantation activities at adiwasiwadi.
- **International Yoga Day Celebration:** The librarian R.S Mashale conducted the program to create awareness on the benefit of yoga and meditation. This event was attended by all teaching and non-teaching fraternity of the college on 21st June, 2016.
- **Awareness driven Anti Narcotic day** : 14th July 2016: Anti-drug addiction rally was organised on 14th July 2016, from college to Tahsil Office, Mhasala .It was followed by a workshop of drug addiction. It was attended by 20 NSS students.
- **World Peace Day** : Rally was organised by with the help of local NGO to observe world Peace day. 60 NSS volunteer participated from S.T stand to College.

HB and Blood Group Checkup.

Goal: a) Knowing Blood Group

b) knowing suitability of blood group while donating blood.

c) Knowing Hb position

d) Knowing Ideal food for sound health

Context: Youth is the reflection of Nation. Youth must be physically as well as mentally fit and strong. S/he must be ready to donate the blood as and when required. In order to that, knowledge of blood group and position of Hb is quite required. To meet this need, the college determined to organize this check up camp on the auspicious date in the life of our college that was 09 February. It is the birth Anniversary of our beloved founder Brrister A.R. Antulay Saheb. prominently, NSS and DLLE took initiative and more than 80% students got themselves checked. Conclusion is most girls suffered from low Hb(anemia). Dr. Fakhi and Mr. Sushil Yadav suggested the measures to maintain standard level of Hb. Besides, the negative effect of lower Hb were also explained. HB check up is very essential for girls students in order to avoid the problems coming in pregnancy and delivery.

Objects : Students' awareness about Hb position and knowledge of their blood group.

Practice : NSS and DLLE students were oriented for active support. Well reputed Pathologists Dr. Fakhi and Mr. Shushil Yadav were appointed to get good result. Prior to camp, publicity was made through banners, posters and lectures of faculty. Reports were given to the participants by Doctor.

Best practice : 2

Title: Student support for career building, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

Goal : Strictly adhering to the vision and mission, and considering the obvious expertise of the students, the institution encourages them to participate in the co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, by way of funding and provision of technical assistance.

The context: The new global job market requires new skills to make one relevant. It has been observed that the students in our region have skill- oriented bent of mind and tremendous physical ability. The institution has been taking extra efforts to develop their skills. Basically, they require assistance on financial and technical level. Once this was provided, the institution got miraculous results.

Objectives:

- To find the potential of the students.
- To provide training for their chosed skill e.g. Sports, Cultural etc.
- To make them confident and employable
- To provide opportunities to work and take experience in the outside work

- To supplement the class room teaching with co curriculum activities

The Practice –

This practice involves support to the students in every way to participate in all the co-curricular and extra-curricular activities and helping them to seek employment through them. Various activities are conducted. Prominent among them are Sports, Cultural, NSS, DLLE, on-the-job trainings etc. The students are picked up in their first year itself. Then they are given training by experts; and finally, they get the opportunity to participate in the inter-collegiate competitions and other competitions. Their success in them is our evidence of success of the scheme. Our support system has the following features.

- There are main ten committees providing support to the activities.
- Dietary supplements to the students who practice regularly.
- Extra DA and duty leaves for practice days.

Problems encountered:

We have not faced any major problems so far. Funding is the only serious problem except for hiring professional for coaching and their availability.

Notes :

- The growing number of girl students in our institution makes us think of modifying the scheme, with overall development of the girls.
